The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based, experiential educational program focused on liturgy and scripture. Children direct their own learning in a carefully prepared environment (an "Atrium") which supports children's unique capabilities and interests, and gives them the opportunity to grow in love and knowledge of God. 
