## Confession of Sin

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

- ¶ *Silence may be kept.*

Most merciful God,  
**we confess that we have sinned against you  
in thought, word, and deed,  
by what we have done,  
and by what we have left undone.  
We have not loved you with our whole heart;  
we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.  
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.  
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,  
have mercy on us and forgive us;  
that we may delight in your will,  
and walk in your ways,  
to the glory of your Name. Amen.**

Almighty God have mercy on us,

 and save us from this generation for ever.

### I Collect of the Day

and boldly confess him as Lord and Savior;  
who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God,  
in glory everlasting.

### II Additional Collects

Most holy God,  
the source of all good desires, all right judgements, and all just works:  
Give to us, your servants, that peace which the world cannot give,  
so that our minds may be fixed on the doing of your will,  
and that we, being delivered from the fear of all enemies,  
may live in peace and quietness;  
through the mercies of Christ Jesus our Savior.

Be our light in the darkness, O Lord,  
and in your great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night;  
for the love of your only Son, our Savior Jesus Christ.

*or*

O God, the life of all who live,  
the light of the faithful,  
the strength of those who labor,  
and the repose of the dead:  
We thank you for the blessings of the day that is past,  
and humbly ask for your protection through the coming night.  
Bring us in safety to the morning hours;  
through him who died and rose again for us,  
your Son our Savior Jesus Christ.

Lord Jesus, stay with us,  
for evening is at hand and the day is past;  
be our companion in the way,  
kindle our hearts, and awaken hope,  
that we may know you as you are revealed in Scripture

O God and Father of all, whom the whole heavens adore: 124  
Let the whole earth also worship you,  
all nations obey you,  
all tongues confess and bless you,  
and men and women everywhere love you and serve you in peace;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Keep watch, dear Lord,  
with those who work, or watch, or weep this night,  
and give your angels charge over those who sleep.  
Tend the sick, Lord Christ; give rest to the weary,  
bless the dying, soothe the suffering,  
pity the afflicted, shield the joyous;  
and all for your love's sake.

*or*

O God, you manifest in your servants the signs of your presence: 125  
Send forth upon us the spirit of love,  
that in companionship with one another  
your abounding grace may increase among us;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

II Let us pray for the homebound.

Look with mercy, O God our Father,  
on all those who are homebound by reason of illness or infirmity,

Provide for them homes of dignity and peace;  
give them understanding helpers,  
and the willingness to accept help.  
Though their strength be diminished,  
increase their faith and their assurance of your love.  
This we ask in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

III Let us pray for those who are expecting a child.

Gracious God, visit your children \_\_\_\_\_ as they await the birth of a child.  
Protect them from all that might threaten them and the child;  
let your holy angels be with them to preserve them in your peace,  
and let your blessing be ever upon them,  
in the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior.

iv Let us pray for the departed.

Almighty God, we remember before you today your faithful servants,  
especially \_\_\_\_\_ and those we name at this time.

Strengthen them by your life-giving Spirit,  
that by their ministries  
the health of the community may be promoted  
and your creation glorified;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

#### *For families and for those who live alone*

Almighty God, our heavenly Father:  
We commend to your continual care the homes in which your people dwell.  
Put far from them, we beseech you,  
every root of bitterness, the desire of vainglory, and the pride of life.  
Fill them with faith, virtue, knowledge, temperance, patience, godliness.  
Grant that those who live alone may not be lonely in their solitude,  
but may find fulfillment in loving you and their neighbors.  
Knit together in constant affection  
those households which you have called together.  
Turn the hearts of the parents to the children,  
and the hearts of the children to the parents;  
and so enkindle fervent charity among us all,  
that we may evermore be kindly affectioned one to another;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

#### *For the absent*

O God, whose fatherly care reaches to the uttermost parts of the earth:  
We humbly beseech you graciously to behold and bless those whom we love,  
now absent from us.  
Defend them from all dangers of soul and body;  
and grant that both they and we, drawing nearer to you,  
may be bound together by your love in the communion of your Holy Spirit,  
and in the fellowship of your saints;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Heavenly Father,
