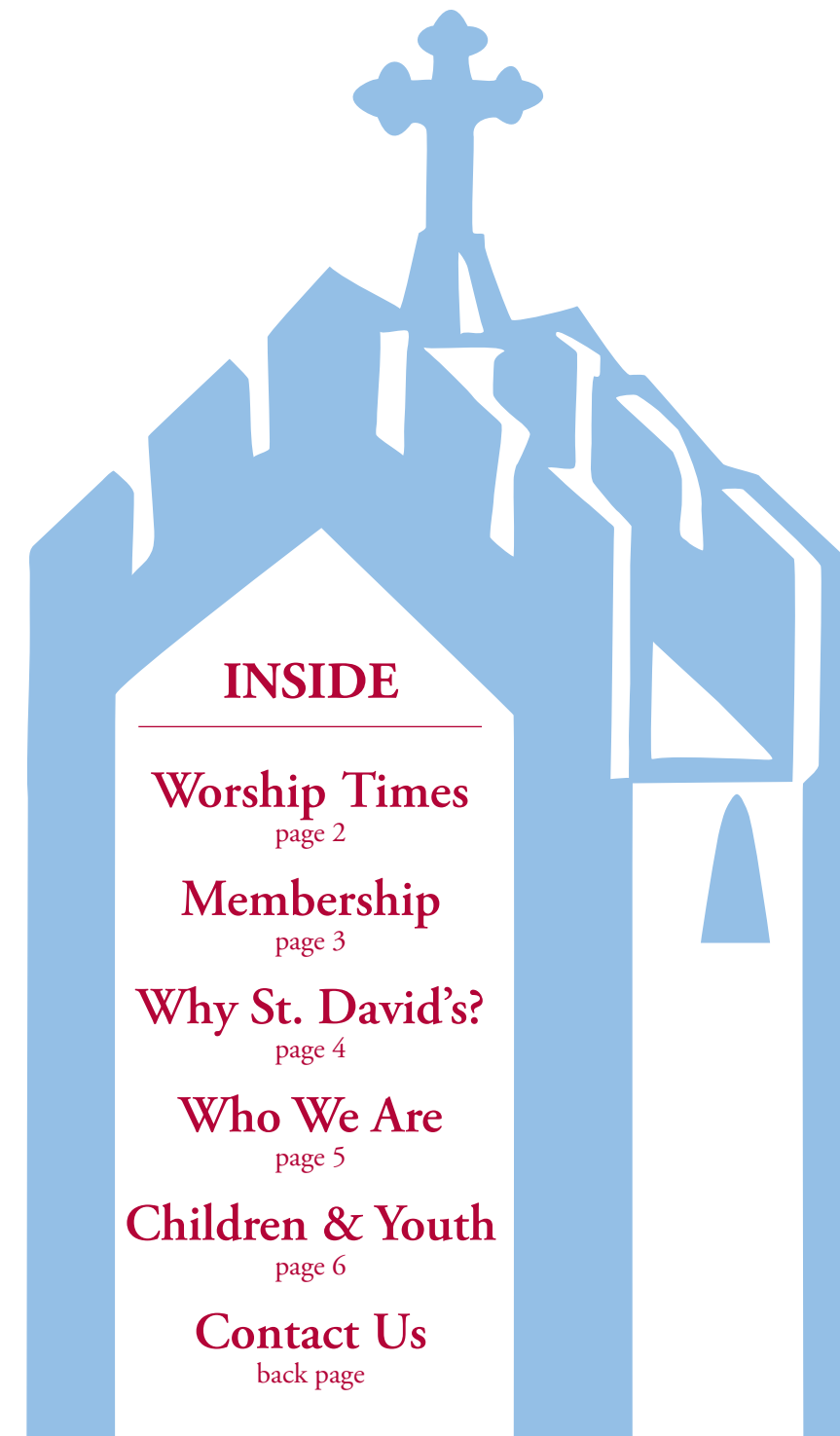

CHILDREN & YOUTH

Children in Worship

While children are always welcome in all worship services, two Sunday services are especially family-friendly. The **9:10 a.m. Eucharist in Bethell Hall** is well-suited for young families and the joyful noise of children. The **9 a.m. Eucharist in the Historic Church** offers Children's Chapel for children ages 3 – 1st grade. Both worship spaces contain shelves with quiet, liturgically-appropriate activities to help children follow the service and stay engaged.

Children's Formation

St. David's offers two excellent curricula for children age 3 through 5th grade: *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* and *Weaving God's Promises*. Drop-off is between 10:15-10:25 a.m.; classes begin at 10:25 a.m. and end at 11:10 a.m. Registration forms must be completed for all students.

Youth

Youth meets regularly for formation on Sunday mornings from 10:25 to 11 a.m. and on Sunday evenings for fellowship and conversation. There are also opportunities throughout the year for community outreach and diocesan youth events.

Child Care (1st floor)

St. David's nursery provides a safe and nurturing environment for the children given to its care. We provide child care for children ages 2 months to 12 years old for a variety of regularly scheduled programs and events, and other church programs upon request.

Child care is provided for those attending worship or church programs on:

- Sunday Mornings: 8:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. (2 mo. to 4 years)
- Wednesday Evenings: 6-9 p.m. (2 mo. to 12 years)
- Friday Mornings: 10 a.m.-noon (2 mo. to 12 years)
- Parents' Night Out: 1st Friday: 6-10p.m. (2 mo. to 12 years; reservation required.)

St. David's Day School (1st floor)

We offer both traditional child development and Montessori curricula. Our mission is to provide children with loving and enriching programs that meet their needs at each developmental level. The Day School is accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children. For ages 15 months – Kindergarten.

Children's and Youth Choirs

Three Children's and Youth choirs (Kindergarten through 12th grade) perform on various Sundays and at special events throughout the school year. All three choirs perform a musical in the spring. The Children's Choirs rehearse from 6 to 7 p.m. on Wednesday evenings during the school year; Youth Choir rehearses on Sundays from 12:45-1:45 p.m.

WHO WE ARE

St. David's Episcopal Church is a diverse worshipping community of believers unified in Jesus Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit to receive and share God's love, hope, joy, vitality, and vision as we serve others.

A Brief History

St. David's maintains the oldest Episcopal Church building in continuous use west of the Mississippi. The cornerstone of St. David's building was laid on April 7, 1853, and the structure was completed in 1854. The parish was originally organized in 1848 as "Christ Church" and was reorganized in 1851 as the "Church of the Epiphany." The Epiphany congregation split over the slavery debate in 1856. Northern sympathizers withdrew, naming their new congregation Christ Church. Three years later, Christ Church was unable to finance a new church building and Church of the Epiphany was without a rector. Necessity forced a reunion of the two congregations. A new name was chosen, "St. David's," honoring Bishop Alexander Gregg who had come to Texas from St. David's Church, Cheraw, South Carolina, and in memory of St. David, the evangelistic Bishop of Wales in the 5th century.

Over the years the building has been enlarged as the congregation has grown. The most recent building expansion was completed in 2003. Today, St. David's is among the largest and most active Episcopal churches in the United States with more than 2,300 members.

The Episcopal Church

St. David's is a part of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas and a member of the Episcopal Church of the United States of America. The Episcopal Church is the American province of the Anglican Communion, a world-wide body of over 70 million Christians who trace their origins to the Church of England. Episcopalians are thinking Christians who engage questions of faith with both seriousness and great joy. Often, The Episcopal Church is called a "bridge church" between Roman Catholicism and Protestant denominations. This is because much Episcopal theology is Protestant in nature, while much of Episcopal worship, spiritual practice, and church structure resembles Catholicism. As a result, individuals and families from a variety of backgrounds will find in the Episcopal Church a home that honors their own faith tradition while providing a new source of shared nourishment. Newcomers will find a diverse faith community that welcomes questions and discussion.

MEMBERSHIP

If you would like to know more about becoming a member of St. David's, you may find these common questions and answers to be helpful to you:

Q: What does it mean to be a member of St. David's?

A: St. David's members are committed to help carry out the Church's mission of restoring all people to unity with God and each other in Christ. This work is carried out by all baptized persons in their work of ministry, which is to bear witness to Christ wherever they may be, and carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world. We ask members to take their place in worship regularly, and to remain faithful in working, praying, and making an annual pledge of financial giving for the benefit of the Kingdom of God.

Q: I've never belonged to any church before. How do I become a Christian and a member of St. David's church?

A: Baptism marks the beginning of a new life in Christ. To become a member of any Episcopal Church, this is the first step. If you've never been baptized, we invite you to contact one of the clergy to learn about the sacrament of Baptism, and how to become baptized.

Q: I've been baptized in a church other than St. David's. How do I become a member here?

A: It's very simple! Inform one of the clergy or the Director of Newcomers that you wish to be made a member. You will be recorded as a member of St. David's parish, and welcomed to participate in all programs and ministries. If your membership is recorded in another Episcopal parish, we will request a letter of transfer be sent on your behalf.
